PTA Guidelines for Candidate Forums

A candidate forum is a powerful tool for achieving the public policy goals of PTA and to build awareness of our association and our work. Sponsoring a candidate forum demonstrates to the candidates that your community cares about what the candidates' positions are and the election outcome. It shows that your association is a leader in local civic affairs. Candidate forums require a time commitment to recruit the attendance of candidates and your audience.

Among factors that make a candidate forum nonpartisan are:

- All candidates for an office are invited. (Even if all are invited, there is a risk that the event could appear partisan, if some candidates refuse to participate.) If only one candidate agrees to attend, it is no longer a forum.
- The rules of the forum don't favor any candidate over another. (Consider using an independent moderator, setting time limits for replies, etc.)

- The questions are fair: Questions should address a broad range of issues, they should not suggest the response the forum sponsor prefers, and they should not be selected to show particular candidates in a better or worse light. This doesn't mean they can't be controversial!
- There should be no campaign materials at the forum. No brochures, flyers, signs, banners or any other materials promoting specific candidates. No campaign buttons or shirts promoting a specific candidate are to be worn by the audience members, the candidates or anyone else attending the forum.
- If it is a two-candidate race and only one agrees to attend, you should not go forward with your forum. In a multi-candidate race, at least two must confirm.
- Confirm with candidates! If it is a two-candidate race, and one cancels with very little notice (after having confirmed attendance) or worse — doesn't show up, you may go forward with the candidate event as planned. Just make sure to announce that this in no way signifies the endorsement of the attending candidate by your organization.

Some guidelines from the IRS:

The forum should cover a broad range of issues

Each candidate should be given equal time to present his or her view on the issues discussed.

The candidates are not asked to agree or disagree with specific positions or platforms of the sponsoring organizations.

The moderator stays neutral and does not imply approval or disapproval of the candidates

2015 Kansas PTA Outstanding Educator Award

(Teacher, Principal, Para-Educator, Administrator or Superintendent)

The purpose of this award is to honor someone who has made an outstanding contribution in the field of education that benefits children and youth. The term "educator" applies to teachers, principals, Para-Educators, administrators or superintendents. Any PTA member, unit, council or region may submit nominations. The nominee must be a member of a local PTA unit and if a teacher or principal, must be from a school that is affiliated with a PTA unit. The honoree will be asked to attend the Kansas PTA State Convention to receive this award.

2015 Kansas PTA Outstanding Student Award

The purpose of this award is to recognize and honor an Outstanding Student from the state of Kansas. This award focuses on the accomplishments of the student and not necessarily on his/her service to PTA. Age is not a factor – any student Kindergarten through 12th grade may qualify. Any PTA member, unit, council or region may submit nominations. The nominee must attend a school that has a PTA unit. The honoree will be asked to attend the Kansas PTA State Convention to receive this award. Accommodations will be provided for the winner and a chaperone if overnight travel is necessary

Kansas PTA Virginia Peak Outstanding Leadership Award

The purpose of this award is to honor someone who has given exemplary service to the children and youth of Kansas. Any PTA member, unit, council or region may submit nominations. The nominee must be a member of a local PTA unit and if a teacher or principal, must be from a school that is affiliated with a PTA unit. Please read this application carefully, all PTAs involved must be in good standing.

National PTA's Every Child in Focus Campaign

National PTA's **Every Child in Focus** is a campaign to strengthen family engagement in schools by celebrating the achievements and reporting the disparities within diverse populations, and sharing resources and advocacy tools to help understand the needs of every child.

Each month, National PTA will spotlight the educational issues surrounding a particular group, highlight their accomplishments and focus on ways to help foster Family-School Partnerships.

The campaign is a school-year-long series that provides educators, families and PTAs with the information they need to deepen family engagement in schools through the PTA National Standards for Family-School Partnerships.



Smart Snacks in School!

Are you familiar with Smart Snacks in School Rule? When planning your fundraisers and events this year please be sure to research the new regulations put in place by the USDA. This rule is a part of Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids act of 2010. There have been a few extra guidelines put in place to promote healthier eating for our children. The Smart Snacks in School Rule went into effect on July 1, 2014. We can no longer have unhealthy food available for purchase on school grounds during any school day. (12:01 a.m. to 30 minutes after the dismissal bell has rung) unless the foods meet the new guidelines put in place. This rule will definitely affect the way PTA's, schools and other organizations fundraise for their activities. However we do believe that this will aid us in our mission for healthy, happy kids. Healthy meal choices paired with activity are just what our students need to keep their minds and bodies strong! Kansas PTA recommends that you sit down and have a conversation with your school administrator to see how your school is handling the changes, and work together to find solutions that work for your PTA and you school.

These events are taking place throughout the world, including here in Kansas. A part of this hands-on educational experience consists of learning about the Web through Web literacy activities. This can be done on a computer, tablet or learning to write code on a piece of paper. Maker Parties can be as small as one or two people sitting around the family kitchen table making items to a larger event at a public café, library or community center.

Maker Parties allow children to use their creativity to make and learn. Get your child excited about making things by hosting your own Maker Party. Challenge participants to make boats out of recycled materials, or learn about coding using post-it notes. Creating your PTA Profile and Frequently Asked Questions for PTA Members

Your 2014-2015 PTA membership card allows you to gain access to membership resources and discounts exclusive to PTA members by creating or annually updating your PTA email profile. All dues paying members of PTA are asked to visit PTA.org/Profile to add your voice to Today's PTA. This allows PTA to better communicate with our members and show the strength of our great association.

WHY SHOULD I CREATE A PTA PROFILE?

- 1) Creating a profile provides all levels of PTA with contact information for individual members. This information is vital for communicating our messages across the nation, uniting and mobilizing members around education issues.
- 2) Creating a profile gives members with access to valuable PTA member benefit discounts on products and services. These savings have a value that in many cases pays for the cost of joining PTA.
- 3) Creating a profile increases member awareness that they are part of a local, state and national network that stretches far beyond their local PTA.
- 4) Creating a PTA Profile provides National PTA with member information to help secure more programs, grants, and funding to support the PTA mission. Statistical and demographic information helps NPTA define the population of our member base and increase our ability to make an impact in federal legislation and other advocacy efforts.

FRONT OF CARD

On the back of the card, the right side includes information about how to contact National PTA and how to activate the card. The left side of the card includes a referral membership application. You may ask people to join PTA with the referral card and give their dues with the application to the local PTA leader.

HOW DO I CREATE MY PTA PROFILE?

The online process takes approximately 5 minutes to complete. You will need an internet connection to visit PTA.org/profile. On the web page, choose the “ACCESS YOUR PTA PROFILE” button. The on-screen instructions will outline the process with required fields shown in red. Once completed, you will see a confirmation page giving the option to link another membership card to your PTA profile by clicking “VALIDATE ANOTHER CARD”. If you have multiple PTA cards, you may click the link to “VALIDATE ANOTHER CARD”. After this process, you may visit PTA.org/benefits to start accessing your PTA member benefits and discounts on retail services and products.

WHAT IF I DO NOT HAVE INTERNET ACCESS?

You may contact National PTA’s customer service center at 1-800-307-4PTA to assist you with your profile creation if you do not have access to internet. However, you will need to have an email address to complete the process, along with a copy of your card to confirm the verification code. The customer service center will create your email profile and collect required data over the phone. The NPTA Customer Service Center is available 8:30am to 5:00pm Monday – Friday, Eastern Standard Time.

WHAT IF I DO NOT CREATE A PTA PROFILE, AM I STILL A MEMBER?

Yes. PTA profile creation is not a required step to be considered a PTA member, however it is strongly encouraged. Creating your email profile allows your voice to be added to Today’s PTA membership base to help secure more programs, gain future grants and funding to support the PTA mission.

WHAT IF MY LOCAL UNIT IS NOT ON THE LIST OF AVAILABLE UNITS TO SELECT?

Make sure you are entering the city and state the school/PTA is located. If you are still experiencing problems with locating your PTA in the list, please contact your PTA leader for assistance.

WHERE IS MEMBER PROFILE DATA STORED AND WHO HAS ACCESS TO IT?

The data collected in the online profile process is stored in a secure, centralized database that is maintained by National PTA. National PTA shares this confidential information only with State PTA offices.

10 Ways to Read Your Kids and Make a Change

Whether you have multiple children or just one, being able to read your kids and make adjustments is important. Becoming good at this can be the difference that takes you to All Pro Dad status. Below are 10 ways to read your kids and make a change as needed.

- 1. Talk to them.** Communication is the number one thing to develop in your relationship. Start a conversation and learn from it.
- 2. Listen to them.** If you talk to them but never listen, it's as good as not even talking. Listen to them and adjust accordingly.
- 3. Ask them questions.** Communication is like tennis. Keep the ball going back over the net. Ask them questions so you can learn, then adjust.
- 4. Takes notes on them.** We can't remember everything about our kids, so take notes—notes about conversations, events, likes/dislikes. Read them from time to time and make adjustments.
- 5. Play games with them.** Playing games with, and competing against, a person will reveal a lot. It'll show you how they handle adversity, frustration, and success, which will enable you to adjust as needed when those emotions arise at other times.
- 6. Spend one-on-one time with them.** My kids love alone time with me. Their "love cup" is filled, but most importantly there are no distractions, which means I can focus solely on them.
- 7. Help them with schoolwork.** This is similar to #5. You'll learn a lot while watching them learn. You'll see how they react to and solve a problem, which educates you on how to help them.
- 8. Read with them** The books they read shape their minds. When you read with them, you'll enter their world and can relate better. As you relate better with them, you can adjust to their needs better.
- 9. Tuck them in at night.** This is another "love cup" filler. Some of the best and most eye-opening conversations happen around this time. Use it to learn more about your kids.
- 10. Huddle up with them.** All Pro Dad's Huddle Up questions can help facilitate all of the above. They are designed to open conversation that isn't surface level. When you get below the surface, you can learn and adjust accordingly.
