As a reminder, per the 2024 National PTA convention, the NPTA body voted for a dues increase, the first in more than 10 years. They delayed the start date for this new dollar amount a year but on July 1, 2025, the new combined dues for state and national PTA for the 2025-2026 school year will become \$5.75 per year. I know A dues increase may cause some concern but trust me when I say that I think that this is still one of the best values for contributing to an association whose voices speak up for children and public education at just \$0.48 per month.

One of the top reasons that people are hesitant to join any membership association is that they don't know the benefits of being a member or why they should join. You can help.

- First, make up a list of the things that you do at your school for the students and teachers. Create a poster listing them and have it at each of your events to remind them that together you all make a difference.
- Tell them about providing a parent voice at the State House and Congress.
- Let them know about the opportunity to receive grant money for STEM nights and for Digital Technology nights.
- Remind them of the great opportunities in the Arts thru the Reflections Program.
- Make sure they know about online training to assist them in handling their duties by visiting pta.org.
- And don't forget family engagement thru Schools of Excellence.

Kansas PTA joined other Kansas education advocacy organizations such as KASB, Kansas NEA, and Game On for Kansas Schools for "I Heart Kansas Public Schools Legislative Day" at the Kansas Capitol, on February 14.

We staffed a table on the first-floor rotunda and were able to catch up with various elected officials walking by. We spoke with freshman and veteran representatives and senators from both sides of the aisle about the great successes of Kansas public schools, such as record-high graduation rates, record number of students earning career credentials, and millions of dollars in scholarships earned.
